## SERIES SCORING SYSTEM

Skippers' meeting 10:00 am. - Last race starts before 2:00pm.

- 1. Entry in Series:** each series will be scored separately. A skipper must compete in 50% of the races to be an "Entrant" in a series.
- 2. Race Scoring:** Each race in a series will be scored separately. (As opposed to considering each sailing day as a score). Scoring will be: 1st = 1 point, 2nd = 2, 3rd = 3. etc... DNF = number of boats starting race +1. DNS = number of boats starting + 2.

DNF. did not finish: boat comes to starting area and starts race but for some reason is unable to finish race (cross finish line). Score is number of boats starting the race including the one receiving the DNF. plus penalty of one point. ie, 10 boats cross Starting line at start signal: DNF score: is  $10 + 1 = 11$ .

DNS. did not start; Boat comes to lake and signs in for day's racing. Individual race starts but for some reason boat cannot start. Score is number of boats crossing start line plus penalty of 2 points. i.e. 8 boats cross starting line at start Signal: DNS score is  $8 + 2 = 10$

- 3. Did Not Race:** An entrant (see item #1) who does not participate on a scheduled sailing day will receive a DNX score, for each race = to the total number of entrants in the series + 2.

DNX. did not race: Boat is entrant in series but does not come to lake on scheduled race day. Score for each race during that day (up to 12 race ) is equal to the number of entrants in the series plus a penalty of 2 points. This score is determined after application of the 50% participation rule.

- 4. Throw-outs:** The total number of completed races will determine the number of scoring races and 25 % will become throw outs. (For a series, throw-outs equal approximately one days racing.)
- 5. Series Scoring:** Number of entrants is determined by the 50% rule (club practice permits member to sail any boat on any day we are at the lake). Boats determined not to be entrants are deleted from the individual race scoring and all entrants have their scores advanced as appropriate. including DNF'S, DNS' and DNX's.
